SB 122, SD1 RELATING TO RENTAL DISCRIMINATION. HOU, JDC Prohibits discrimination, including in advertisements for available (SSCR480)

real property, based on participation in a housing assistance Status & Testimony program, or requirements related to participation in housing assistance programs, in real estate transactions and requirements.

RELATING TO ASSISTANCE ANIMALS. SB 334, SD1 CPH, JDC

Codifies the administrative rule definition of "assistance animal". (SSCR378) Clarifies the type of verification an individual may provide to Status & Testimony substantiate a reasonable accommodation request for an assistance animal. Specifies that possession of a vest or other distinguishing animal garment, tag, or registration document commonly purchased online and purporting to identify an animal as a service animal or assistance animal does not constitute valid

verification of a disability-related need for an assistance animal. (SD1)

RELATING TO PUBLIC MEETINGS. SB 335, SD1 GVO. JDC

Requires public meeting notices to include instructions regarding (SSCR639) accommodations for persons with disabilities. Requires boards to post public meeting notices on an electronic calendar on a state Status & Testimony maintained website, file a copy with the office of the lieutenant governor or the appropriate county clerk's office, retain a copy of proof of filing, and post a notice in the board's office. Requires the office of the lieutenant governor or the appropriate clerk's office to timely post paper or electronic copies of all meeting notices in a central location in a public building. Requires a meeting to be canceled when the written public notice is posted on an electronic calendar less than six days prior to the meeting. Requires an emergency meeting agenda to be filed with the office of the lieutenant governor or the appropriate county clerk's office and

posted in the board's office. (SD1)

RELATING TO GENDER IDENTIFICATION. SB 429 TRS, JDC

Requires a license to include a person's full legal name, date of (SSCR359) birth, gender category, residence address, and license or identification card number. Includes a third option of gender Status & Testimony identification for driver's license and state identification card

applicants. Effective 7/1/2020.

RELATING TO SHARK AND RAY PROTECTION. SB 489, SD1 WTL, JDC

Establishes an offense of knowingly capturing, taking, possessing, abusing, entangling, or killing a shark in state marine waters, along (SSCR18) with penalties and fines. Expands the existing prohibition on Status & Testimony knowingly capturing or killing a manta ray in state marine waters to

apply to all rays and to also include knowingly taking, possessing, abusing, or entangling a ray. Provides certain exemptions. (SD1)

RELATING TO FIREARMS. **SB 600** PSM. JDC Provides that no person less than 21 years of age shall bring any

(SSCR430) firearm into the State.

SB 621, SD1 RELATING TO FIREARMS. PSM. JDC Requires a person to report the person's lost, stolen, or destroyed

(SSCR431) firearms to the appropriate county police department. Establishes

penalties for failure to report. (SD1) Status & Testimony

RELATING TO LIQUOR. SB 638, SD1 CPH, JDC

Adds unlicensed sale of liquor and unlicensed manufacture of liquor as offenses for which property is subject to forfeiture and increases the grade of the offense of unlicensed sale of liquor to a (SSCR380) Status & Testimony

class C felony. Amends definitions of "organized crime" and 'racketeering activity" to include the unlicensed sale of liquor (SD1)

JDC Creates a non-compliant identification card for individuals that are (SSCR268) not able to provide an updated photograph and documentation in-Status & Testimony person as required by the REAL ID Act of 2005. SB 693, SD1 RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. TRS, JDC Clarifies what pedestrians are required to do when in a crosswalk (SSCR120) while a countdown timer is operating. (SD1) Status & Testimony RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. **SB 895** CPH, JDC Extends the offense of false labeling of Hawaii-grown coffee to (SSCR477) include roasted coffee. Status & Testimony RELATING TO LAND RECORDATION. SB 898, SD1 WTL, JDC Clarifies requirements for land recordation of deregistered lands by (SSCR16) the bureau of conveyances to include a plan of the parcels or parcels sought to be deregistered that includes a map and Status & Testimony description prepared by a licensed professional surveyor. (SD1) PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE X, SECTION 6, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION, TO MODIFY THE APPOINTMENT PROCESS FOR THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF **SB 928** HRE, JDC (SSCR41) THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Status & Testimony Proposes an amendment to article X, section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution to modify the appointment process for the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii. Repeals the Candidate Advisory Council for the Board of Regents of the University of RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL BUILDINGS. **SB 940** PSM/AEN, JDC Grants county agencies the implicit right to enter property to (SSCR440) investigate agricultural buildings and structures for violations of, and compliance with, building permit and code exemption Status & Testimony qualifications. SB 1041, SD1 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES. LCA, JDC Prohibits written nondisclosure agreements involving sexual (SSCR606) assault and sexual harassment as part of an employee's conditions of employment. Prohibits employers from retaliating against an Status & Testimony employee for disclosing or discussing sexual harassment or sexual assault. Takes effect on 1/1/2051. (SD1) RELATING TO HEALTH CARE SB 1043, SD1 CPH, JDC Requires health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health (SSCR560) maintenance organizations to provide coverage for a Status & Testimony comprehensive category of reproductive health services, drugs, devices, products, and procedures. Prohibits discrimination in the provision of reproductive health care services. (SD1) SB 1048, SD1 RELATING TO SEXUAL HARASSMENT. LCA, JDC Makes unenforceable confidentiality clauses in employment (SSCR607) contracts when an act of sexual harassment is claimed by an employee. Bans mandatory arbitration agreements as to sexual harassment claims beginning July 1, 2019. Makes mandatory confidentiality clauses in an arbitration agreement unenforceable Status & Testimony as to sexual harassment claims. Takes effect 1/1/2051. (SD1) RELATING TO FIREARMS. SB 1321, SD1 PSM, JDC Clarifies that failure to register a firearm within the required time (SSCR573) period does not relieve the owner of the duty to register the firearm. Allows the owner of an unregistered firearm to register the Status & Testimony firearm thereafter without penalty. (SD1) SB 1344, SD1 RELATING TO DEBT. TRS, JDC Prohibits the imposition of restrictions on a person's ability to obtain (SSCR383) or renew a driver's license or to register, renew the registration of, or transfer or receive title to a motor vehicle, as a consequence of Status & Testimony unpaid monetary obligations. Does not affect driver's license suspensions related to excessive speeding, lack of motor vehicle insurance, or non-compliance with a child support order. (SD1) RELATING TO LAY NETS. SB 1371, SD1 WTL, JDC Prohibits the use of lay nets to take aquatic life, except under a (SSCR395) permit obtained by the department of land and natural resources. Establishes the use of lay nets to take aquatic life as a Status & Testimony misdemeanor offense with a mandatory minimum period of imprisonment of one day or, for a first offense, a fine of no less than \$1,000. Takes effect 12/31/2050. (SD1) RELATING TO GUN VIOLENCE PROTECTIVE ORDERS. SB 1466, SD1 PSM, JDC Establishes a process by which a law enforcement officer or family (SSCR483)
