RELATING TO BOARDS OF REGISTRATION.

Allows the chief election officer to compensate members of the boards of registration according to a schedule established by the chief election officer by rule. (JUD,FIN)

8B 1309 SD1 HD1 **HSCR 1188**

RELATING TO CRIMINAL INJURIES COMPENSATION.

Provides for compensation for state residents who are victims of terroristic acts; provides for state residents to receive compensation if not fully compensated by the state in which the crime occurred; and disallows compensation to any victim injured or killed while confined in a correctional facility. (JUD,FIN)

SB 2402 SD1 HD1 H6CR 344-98

RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE.

Changes operative period of protective orders from a maximum of 3 years to a minimum of 30 days; removes "recent" from the law governing the police issuance of 24-hour warnings; changes phrases "cooling off period" to "period of separation" and "domestic violence treatment and counseling" to "domestic violence intervention"; and allows courte to sentence a defendant convicted of a misdemeanor domestic violence offense to a period of probation of 2 years. (JUD.FIN)

SB 1273 SD1 HD1 HSCR 842-98

RELATING TO VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT.

Permits victims of sexual assault to require the accused defendant to be tested for HIV. (JUD, FIN)

SB 2254 8D2 HD1 HSCR 843-98

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

Allows the court to require that persons convicted of prostitution receive prostitution intervention services as part of sentence of probation. (JUD,FIN)

SB 2399 SD2 HD1 HSCR 1019-98

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

Establishes a pilot program for clean elections for state senator and state representative in 2000; requires participating candidates to comply with expanditure limits and raise no private contributions except for seed money and minimum qualifying contributions; and moneys to come from the Hawaii election campaign fund. (JUD,FIN)

Amends the definition of "claimant agency" to include the Judiciary so that they are allowed to collect outstanding fines and debts owed to them through the interception of state income

tax refunds of taxpayers with outstanding fines or debts. (JUD.FIN)

8B 2762 HD1 H3CR 892-88 RELATING TO THE RELIEF OF CERTAIN PERSONS' CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE

Appropriates funds to satisfy claims against the State. (JUD,FIN)

SB 2849 SD1 HD1 HSCR 893-98 RELATING TO CIGARETTE SALES TO MINURS.

Increases fines for persons selling or furnishing tobacco products to minors; and increases

fines for minors purchasing tobacco products. (JUD, FIN)

SB 2983 SD2 HD1 HSCR 895-98 RELATING TO OFFICE OF INFORMATION PRACTICES.

Requires open meetings law to be administered by the office of information practices (OIP); moves OIP from the department of the attorney general to the office of the lieutenant

governor for administrative purposes. (JUD,FIN)

system's not being year 2000 compliant. (JUD,FIN)
